SAFETY TIP1

KEEP CANDY AWAY FROM PETS

Halloween treats are toxic to pets. Chocolate can be very dangerous for cats and dogs and sugar-free candies containing the sugar substitute **xylitol** can cause serious problems in pets.

SAFETY TIP2

BE CAREFUL WITH COSTUMES

Wearing a costume may cause stress for some pets so only put a costume on them if you know they love it. Make sure the costume does not limit their movement, sight or ability to breathe. Make sure there are no pieces that can cause a choke hazard.

SAFETY TIP3

KEEP YOUR PET CALM

Too many strangers can be stressful and scary for pets. Keep them in a separate room away from the front door during peak trick-or-treating hours. This will help prevent them from darting outside when you open the door.

PROPER IDENTIFICATION FOR YOUR PET

Always make sure your pet is wearing proper identification!

Halloween brings a lot of excitement and activity to your front door. This can be very stressful for your pet!

If your furry friend escapes, a collar with ID tags and a microchip can be a lifesaver for a pet.

Be prepared - call the Pet Center to schedule an appointment to get your pet microchipped for only \$10.00



Keep Pets Safe

- Pets can be a target of pranks and abuse, keep them safe and out of danger.
