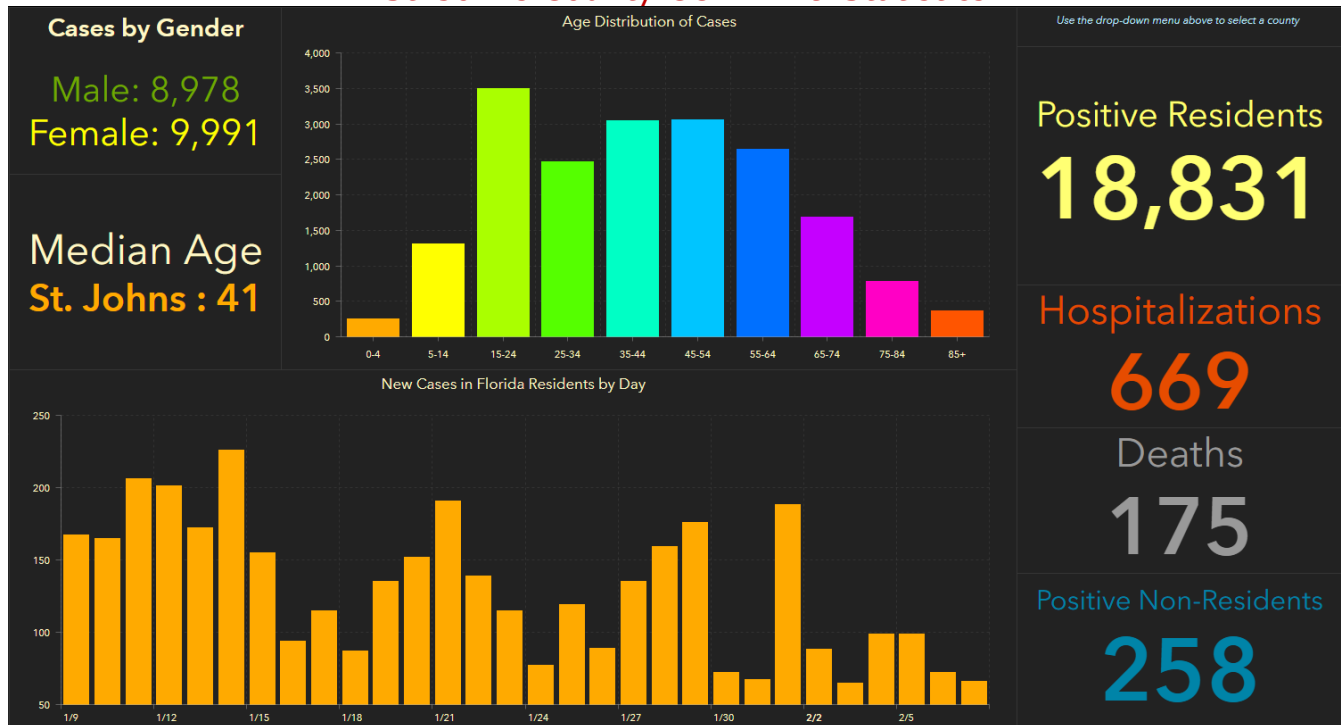

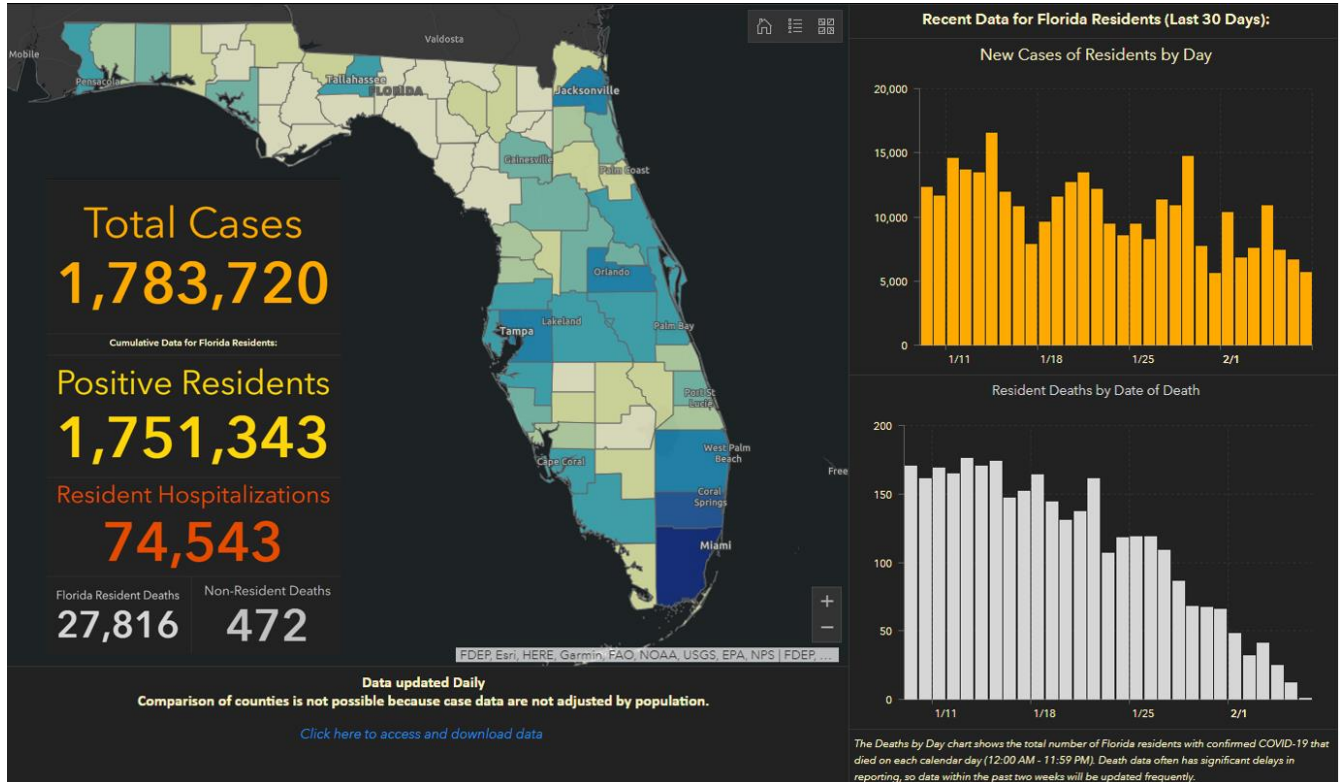
St. Johns County COVID-19 Statistics

- St. Johns County has established a COVID-19 Vaccine Information Hotline operational daily from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. The number is 904-295-3711.
- To sign up for vaccine updates via text, text SJCVaccine to 888777.
- CVS and Walgreens have continue vaccinating residents and staff of long term care facilities throughout the county.
- The current priority for vaccination efforts are frontline healthcare workers, staff/residents of long term care facilities and 65 years and older.
- An appointment-based vaccination site has been established at the Solomon Calhoun Community Center.
- Vaccination appointments will be available when additional shipments of vaccine are received. When available, appointments can be made by telephone at 904-295-3711 or online at <https://tinyurl.com/y52tcoaz>.
- Planning and distribution remains a key focus for the St. Johns County.
- A Public Health Advisory has been issued by the State of Florida Department of Health requiring vaccine recipients provide proof of residency (full or part-time in the State of Florida) or proof they are present in Florida for the purpose of providing health care services involving direct contact with patients.

COVID-19 Test Collection Sites

- COVID-19 Test Collection Site at Regency Square Mall – SEARS, 9501 Arlington Expressway, Jacksonville, FL 32225
 - Open to St. Johns County residents and anyone that would like to be tested.
 - Must have Identification

This site will operate from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week, for as long as supplies last. While a doctor's order and appointment are not required at this location, clients will be evaluated by a medical professional on site.

 - As part of disease control investigations, DOH-SJC is collecting specimens for COVID-19 laboratory testing. As part of disease investigations, specimen collection is by appointment-only for those individuals who meet the CDC criteria for testing. Calls received outside of standard business hours will be redirected to a DOH-SJC Public Health Nurse.

Collection is being treated as an urgent care doctor's visit and clients must bring a photo ID and insurance card. The collection facility has a tent outside and have requested that visitors wait in their cars for paperwork to be brought to them by a staff member.
 - Performing antibody testing. It is NOT required BUT helpful to bring a copy of test results to show you have previously tested positive for the virus. It is \$255.00 total including the office visit for the antibody testing. Some insurances will cover costs. Individuals can walk-in WITHOUT an appointment but CAN NOT have symptoms.

 - Florida Department of Health in Saint Johns County phone number has changed to 904-506-6081.
 - St. Johns County - Mandates the Use of Face Coverings in all County Facilities
 - In an effort to minimize the spread of COVID-19, a face covering mandate for all St. Johns County-owned facilities is in effect. All employees and any person working, doing business, or visiting a County facility are required to wear a face covering when social distancing of six feet or more cannot be maintained.  - City of St. Augustine Beach - Pursuant to Resolution 20-14, the following regulations remain in effect in the City of St. Augustine Beach for so long as a state of emergency is in effect or unless otherwise modified or repealed.

Every person working, living, visiting, or doing business in the City of St. Augustine Beach shall wear a face covering in any indoor location, other than their home or residence, when not maintaining social distancing from other person(s), excluding family members or companions.
