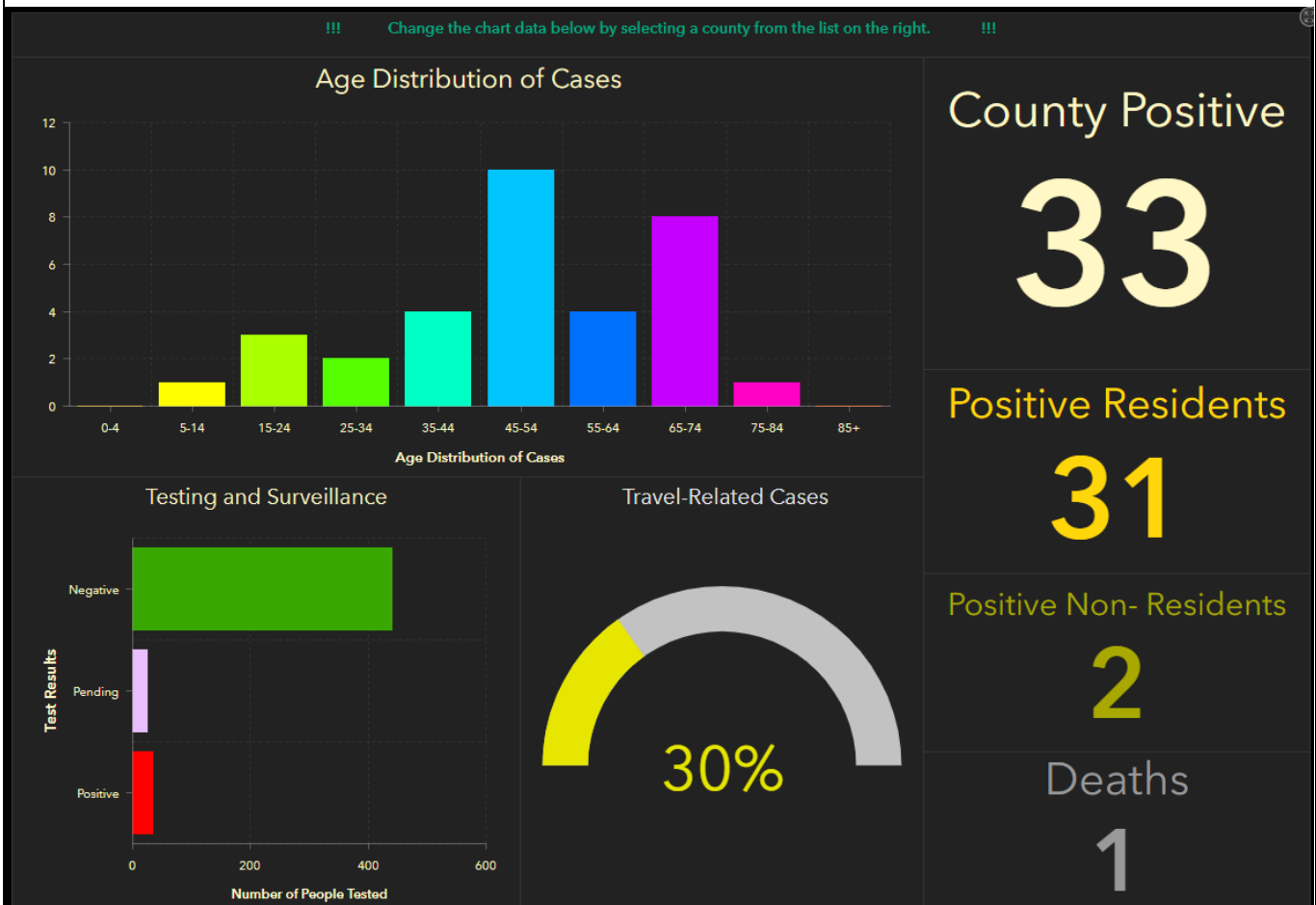

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Current Event Status

- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) that was first detected in China and has now been detected internationally, including the United States and locally in St. Johns County.

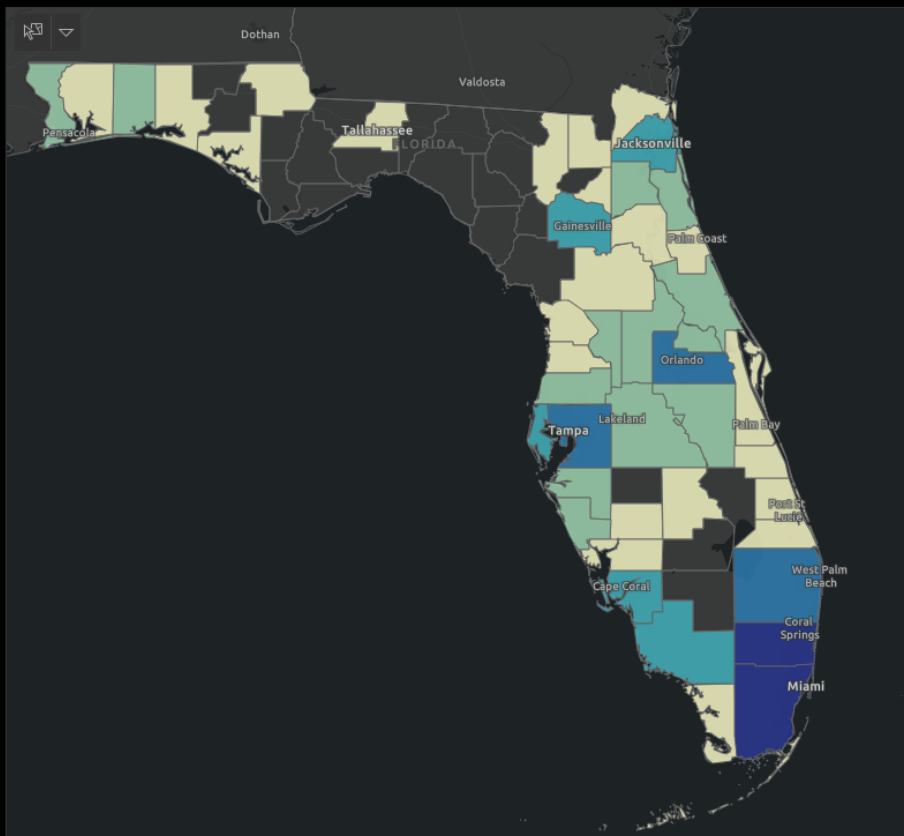

COVID-19 Test Collection Sites

- Federal Test Collection Site – TIAA Bank Field Lot J (Jacksonville Jaguars Stadium)
 - Hours of Operations 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, do not get in line before 8:00 am. All ages are eligible, but **MUST** be symptomatic. Exceptions include First Responders and Healthcare Providers, must be able to provide valid employee identification.
- Coronavirus Test Collection Sites in St. Johns County are as follows:
 - Flagler Health+ - Please note that this is NOT one of the drive through testing sites you have seen or heard about on the news. This outdoor test collection site has been established for patients who have a physician order for COVID-19 testing and have pre-registered. We know there are many people in our community desiring to be tested and understand your frustration. Flagler Health+ currently has a limited quantity of test kits available and we must focus first on ensuring that our community's most vulnerable people with symptoms and risk for complications get the testing and care they need.
 - Florida Department of Health - This collection site is for individuals who have a physician's order for COVID-19 testing.
 - Avencia Medical - Julington Creek Branch, 1633 Race Track Rd, St Johns, FL 32259 (904) 230-6988

- Test collection site for Law Enforcement Officers, First Responders and spouses, do not have to be symptomatic, do not take appointments, but they prefer they call ahead to provide instructions.
- Tent outside to complete paper work. If symptomatic they ask for the individuals to wait in the car. They will charge insurance but are waving all co-pays and out of pocket for Law Enforcement Officers, First Responders and spouses. Need to bring employee ID

Current and Anticipated Actions/Protective Measures

- St. Johns County EOC is activated to a Level II – Partial Activation.
 - The St. Johns County EOC Citizens Information Line is open to assist with residents with questions and concerns at 904-824-5550. Hours of Operations will be 8:00 am – 6:00 pm, 7 days a week.
- St. Johns County has implemented elevated cleaning services. In addition, employee work and travel policies have been implemented to safeguard a healthy workplace.

Government / Schools / Hospital Status

St. Johns County Government	Status:	Operational – St. Johns County facilities are operating under limited public access restrictions.
City of St. Augustine	Status:	Operational – City offices are closed to the Public. Offices will operate and implement numerous methods via the web, email, and phone to assist customers in conducting all necessary business.
City of St. Augustine Beach	Status:	Operational
St. Johns County School District	Status:	St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) students will begin online learning on Monday, March 30 th . will not return to school campuses until Wednesday, April 15 th . All school offices will be closed to the public. Access will be limited to phone or email. Please see Community Information regarding Meal Service.
Florida School for Deaf and Blind	Status:	Florida School for Deaf and Blind students will not return to school campuses until Wednesday, April 15 th .
Flagler College	Status:	All classes will be online for the remainder of the spring semester. All college events through the end of May have also been canceled, including the May Graduation ceremony.
St. Johns River State College	Status:	All SJR State classes (online and on-campus) will be cancelled through March 29. Classes will resume on March 30 in an online format through the end of the semester. All campuses will remain closed to students and employees until further notice. All public and College-sponsored events have been canceled for the remainder of the spring semester.

Flagler Hospital	Status:	Operational - All patient visitation has been suspended. Exceptions will be made for the most critical, extenuating circumstances and spouses/partners of Labor and Delivery patients. Permitted visitors will be screened for fever, cough and shortness of breath and will not be allowed entry if they have symptoms. All entry into the hospital will be limited to the Emergency Department entrance.
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Community Cancellations and Closures

- The City of St. Augustine has executed Administrative Order 2020-06, to extend current restrictions and guidelines through May 8, 2020, which is consistent with the Governor’s Executive Orders. This includes the following:
 - All permitted events, festivals, and large gatherings are cancelled;
 - All public meetings, including City Commission, Code Enforcement Adjustments and Appeals Board, Historic Architectural Review Board, and Planning and Zoning Board, except for emergency meetings as needed, are cancelled;
 - All non-essential meetings that do not address the immediate operations and function of municipal business are cancelled;
 - The Governor’s Emergency Order 20-71 prohibits all on-site consumption of food or alcohol by vendors and licensed establishments;
 - The Visitor Information Center is closed, and all City-managed on-street and off-street parking is suspended;
 - All parking meters, payment kiosks, and mobile parking app (ParkStAug) will not accept payments;
 - Termination of water service for non-payment will be suspended;
 - City Hall offices are closed to the public;
 - For the duration of time while City offices are closed to public access, convenience fees for payment will be waived.

- The St. Johns County Recreation Advisory Board meeting scheduled for April 9 has been cancelled.

- St. Johns County Utility Customer Service/Billing lobby is closed to walk-in customers until further notice. Their on-site drive through, drop box locations, and pay-by-phone options will remain open to accept payments and provide services. Online bill payment and other utility services are also available at www.sjcfl.us/utilities.

- The St. Johns County Utility Department is suspending late fees on utility bills, effective immediately, in an attempt to ease financial strain on families and businesses impacted by

COVID-19. In addition, the Utility Department will not disconnect services on accounts with an outstanding balance. These measures are in effect until further notice. Customers with past-due balances that predate the current health emergency are still expected to pay for their services.

- The St Johns County Public Library System is now offering county residents instant online eCard signup. If you don't already have one, you can get a temporary library card, good for 60 days, to access the library's online collection of eBooks, eAudiobooks, streaming movies, music, digital magazines, and more. Signing up is easy right from the library's website, www.sjcpls.org. Make sure you write down the card number after you register.
- The Youth Services Team of the St. Johns County Public Library System will be providing Storytime, via Facebook Live, at 11am, Monday through Friday. If you can't watch it at that time, they are archived on the Library's Facebook Page.
- Governor Ron DeSantis activated the Florida Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program to support small businesses impacted by COVID-19. The bridge loan program, managed by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), will provide short-term, interest-free loans to small businesses that experience economic injury from COVID-19. The application period runs through May 8.
