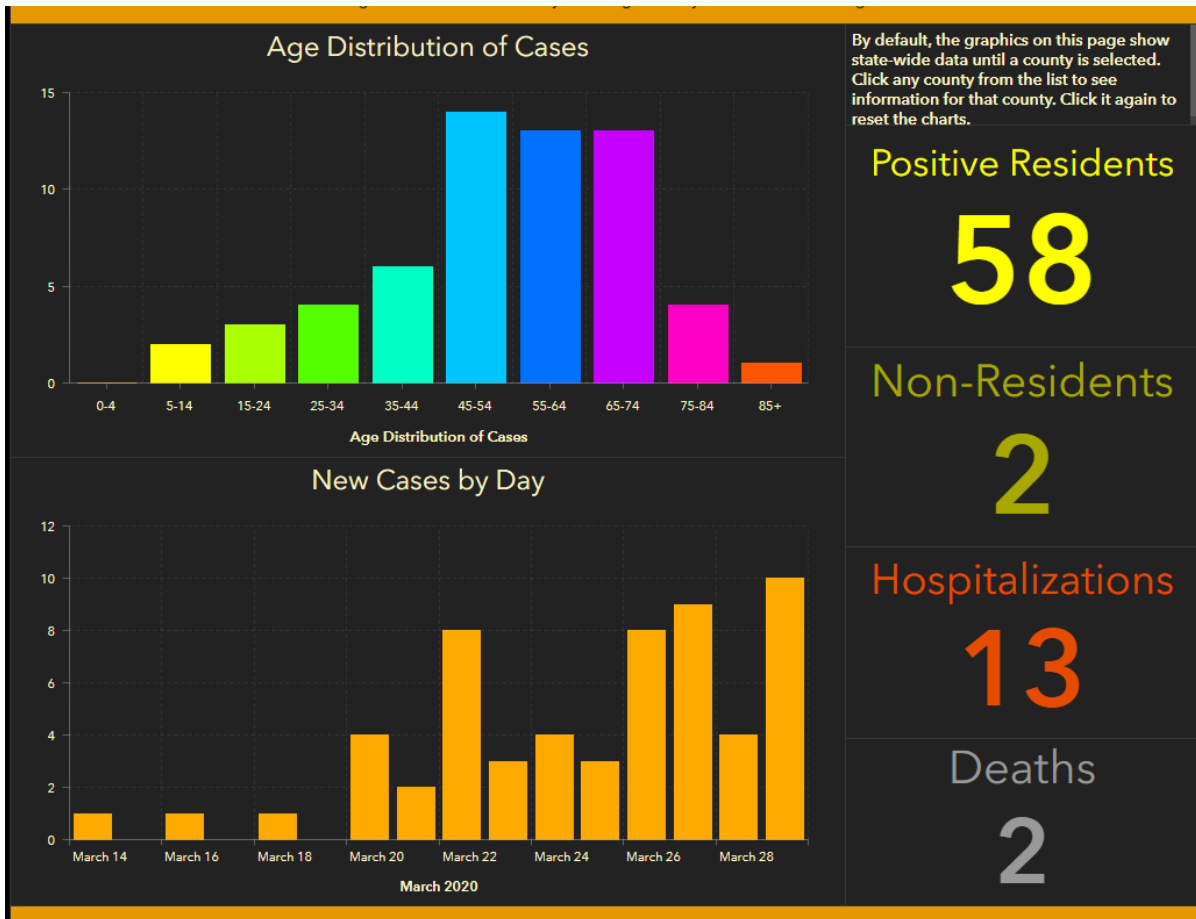

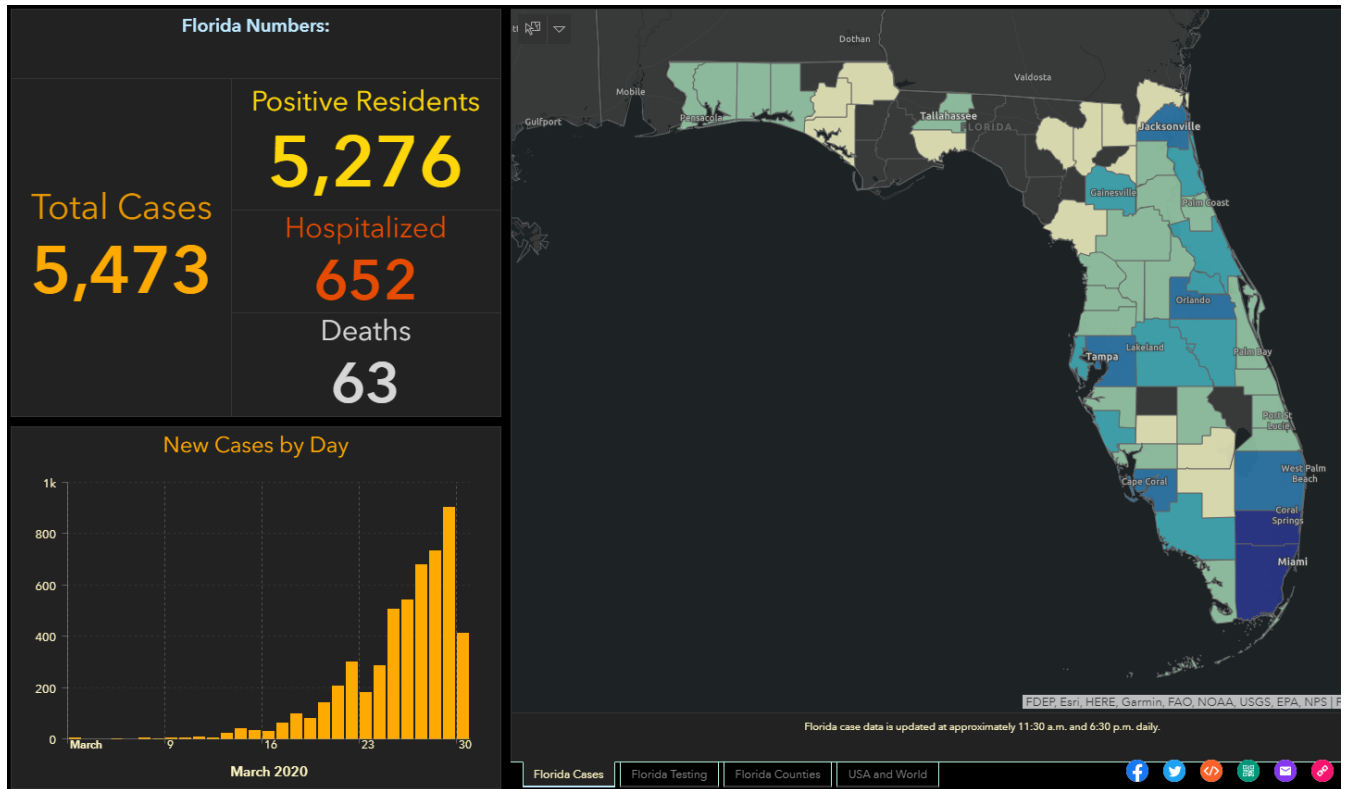
Current Event Status

- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) that was first detected in China and has now been detected internationally, including the United States and locally in St. Johns County.

COVID-19 Test Collection Sites

- Federal Test Collection Site – TIAA Bank Field Lot J (Jacksonville Jaguars Stadium)
 - Hours of Operations 9:00 am – 5:00 pm, do not get in line before 8:00 am. All ages are eligible, but **MUST** be symptomatic. Patients no longer need a temperature higher than 99.6, but must still exhibit respiratory symptoms, to qualify for a test. Exceptions include First Responders and Healthcare Providers, must be able to provide valid employee identification.
- Coronavirus Test Collection Sites in St. Johns County are as follows:
 - Flagler Health+ - 400 Healthpark Blvd., St. Augustine, FL 32086. Outdoors at tent
 - Please note that this is NOT one of the drive through testing sites you have seen or heard about on the news. Hours of operation Monday – Friday, 8:00 – 12:00 pm. This outdoor test collection site has been established for patients who have a physician order for COVID-19 testing and have pre-registered. We know there are many people in our community desiring to be tested and understand your frustration. Flagler Health+ currently has a limited quantity of test kits available and we must focus first on ensuring that our community's most vulnerable people with symptoms and risk for complications get the testing and care they need.

- Florida Department of Health in St. Johns County (DOH-SJC) –St. Johns County Health & Human Services Building , 200 San Sebastian View, St. Augustine, FL 32084. (904) 209-3250
 - As part of disease control investigations, DOH-SJC is collecting specimens for COVID-19 laboratory testing. As part of disease investigations, specimen collection is by appointment-only for those individuals who meet the CDC criteria for testing. For more information about COVID-19 and testing, the Florida Department of Health in St. Johns County’s COVID-19 Call Center is open seven days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and can be reached at 904-209-3250. Calls received outside of standard business hours will be redirected to a DOH-SJC Public Health Nurse.
- Avencia Medical - Julington Creek Branch, 1633 Race Track Rd, St Johns, FL 32259 (904) 230-6988
 - Open to the public from 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, as a COVID-19 collection site. Collection is being treated as an urgent care doctor’s visit and clients must bring a photo ID and insurance card. The collection facility has a tent prepared outside and have requested that visitors wait in their cars for paperwork to be brought to them by a staff member. Current and Anticipated Actions/Protective Measures

- St. Johns County EOC is activated to a Level II – Partial Activation.

Government / Schools / Hospital Status

St. Johns County Government	Status:	Operational – St. Johns County facilities are operating under limited public access restrictions.
City of St. Augustine	Status:	Operational – City offices are closed to the Public. Offices will operate and implement numerous methods via the web, email, and phone to assist customers in conducting all necessary business.
City of St. Augustine Beach	Status:	Operational – Public Meeting Rooms closed. Limited public access in Commission Chambers for Commission Meetings.
St. Johns County School District	Status:	St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) students have begun an online learning environment. All school offices will be closed to the public. Access will be limited to phone or email. Please see Community Information regarding Meal Service.

Florida School for Deaf and Blind	Status:	Florida School for Deaf and Blind students will not return to school campuses until Wednesday, April 15th.
Flagler College	Status:	All classes will be online for the remainder of the spring semester. All college events through the end of May have also been canceled, including the May Graduation ceremony.
St. Johns River State College	Status:	Classes have resumed in an online format through the end of the semester. All campuses will remain closed until further notice. All public and College-sponsored events have been canceled for the remainder of the spring semester.
Flagler Hospital	Status:	Operational - All patient visitation has been suspended. Exceptions will be made for the most critical, extenuating circumstances and spouses/partners of Labor and Delivery patients. Permitted visitors will be screened for fever, cough and shortness of breath and will not be allowed entry if they have symptoms. All entry into the hospital will be limited to the Emergency Department entrance.

Community Cancellations and Closures

- City of St. Augustine Beach Planning and Zoning Board for April Cancelled.
- St. Johns County Clerk of the Court
 - Suspended all public services until April 20, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. except those deemed to be "mission critical" as defined in Circuit Judge Howard Maltz's Administrative Order regarding court closure and emergency procedures. A list of mission critical services is available at stjohnsclerk.com. All other court proceedings are hereby cancelled and will be rescheduled. All other filings, recordings, and marriage services are hereby suspended until April 20, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. The public may also visit <https://stjohnsclerk.com> to pay fines, file court documents and more.
- The Seventh Judicial Circuit of Florida (St. Johns, Flagler, Putnam and Volusia counties) has suspended normal court operations, except for those proceedings deemed mission critical, as set forth in Administrative Order Z-2020-032, which can be found at: <http://www.circuit7.org/Communications/Chief%20Judge%20Coronavirus%20Message%202.pdf>. The members of the judicial branch of government have been working tirelessly through the current Covid-19 emergency to balance public safety with access to the courts. Questions regarding particular matters may be directed to the assigned judges' office or the Clerk of Court.
- Jury Duty - Due to the impact of the Coronavirus outbreak (COVID-19), the Florida Supreme Court has suspended all grand jury proceedings, jury selection proceedings and criminal and civil jury trials through Friday, April 17th 2020. Those who have been summoned for jury duty through April 17th are hereby excused and do not need to report. The courthouse remains open for all other services, many of which may be performed online at <https://stjohnsclerk.com>.
- Governor Ron DeSantis by Executive Order:

- Executive Order 20-86: Directing all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the State of Louisiana, inclusive of those entering the State of Florida by roadways, to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.
- Executive Order 20-87: Ordering all parties engaged in rental of vacation rental properties, as defined in section 509.242(1)(c), Florida Statutes, to suspend vacation rental operations. Vacation rentals are prohibited from making new reservations or bookings and shall not accept new guests for check-in for the duration of this order. This directive shall include the rental of any house, condominium, cooperative, or dwelling unit that is also a transient public lodging establishment, as defined under Section 509.013(4)(a), Florida Statutes. This directive shall not include hotels, motels, inns, resorts, non-transient public lodging establishments, or time share projects; long-term rentals; or rental stays where guests are currently staying in a vacation rental or have previously booked a stay and are scheduled to check-in no later than March 28, 2020.
- FWC Executive Order 20-09: Suspends any provisions of Section 327.02, F.S., Section 327.46, F.S., or any other provision of Chapter 327 or regulation thereunder that limits the Fish and Wildlife Commission's ability to implement boating restrictions on the vessels on the waters of this state necessary to enforce effective social distancing provisions to include behavior that may result in mass gatherings or congregations of people susceptible to the spread of COVID-19 and limit recreational vessel occupancy to no more than 10 persons per vessel with a minimum distance of 50 feet between recreational vessels and any other vessel.
- St. Johns County beaches are closed.

Community Information

- Governor DeSantis has ordered a vehicle check on I-95 similar to current operations occurring on I-10 in the panhandle (for vehicles from Louisiana). All southbound traffic will be routed through the weigh station looking for vehicles from New York, New Jersey and Connecticut. Department of Health officials will be asking them questions about their destination and giving them self-quarantine information. They will close the southbound exit to US 17, which may impact the I-95 exit to SR-200. This will be a 24-hour operation.
- Florida Attorney General Price Gouging Hotline: 1-866-966-7226
 - Price gouging is legally defined as when the price of a necessary commodity, is sold at a price "significantly" higher than its average over the last 30 days.
- Florida Department of Business & Professional Regulation

- Notice is hereby given that one or more members of the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, will hold a special meeting on Tuesday, March 31, 2020, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Auditorium located in the County Administration Building at 500 San Sebastian View, St. Augustine, FL 32084
- The St. Johns County Utility Department is suspending late fees on utility bills, effective immediately, in an attempt to ease financial strain on families and businesses impacted by COVID-19. In addition, the Utility Department will not disconnect services on accounts with an outstanding balance. These measures are in effect until further notice.
- The St Johns County Public Library System is now offering county residents instant online eCard signup. If you don't already have one, you can get a temporary library card, good for 60 days, to access the library's online collection of eBooks, eAudiobooks, streaming movies, music, digital magazines, and more.
