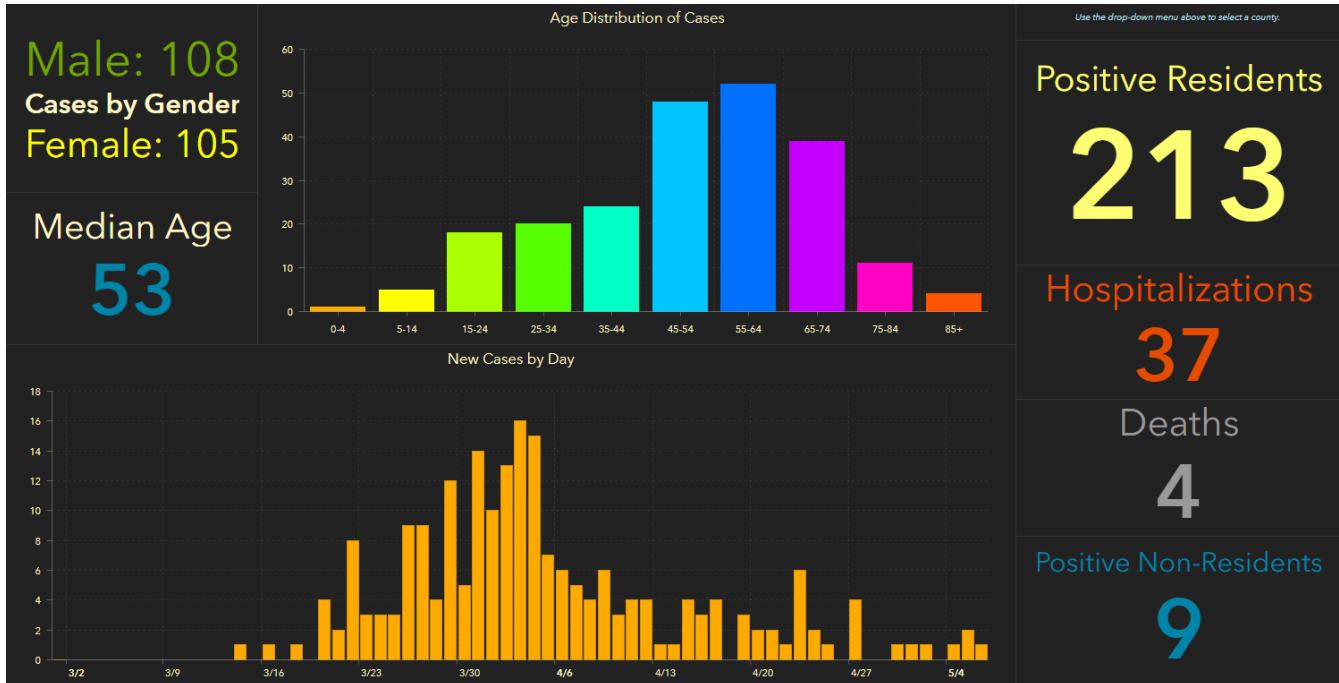

- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) is responding to an outbreak of respiratory disease caused by a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) that was first detected in China and has now been detected internationally, including the United States and locally in St. Johns County.

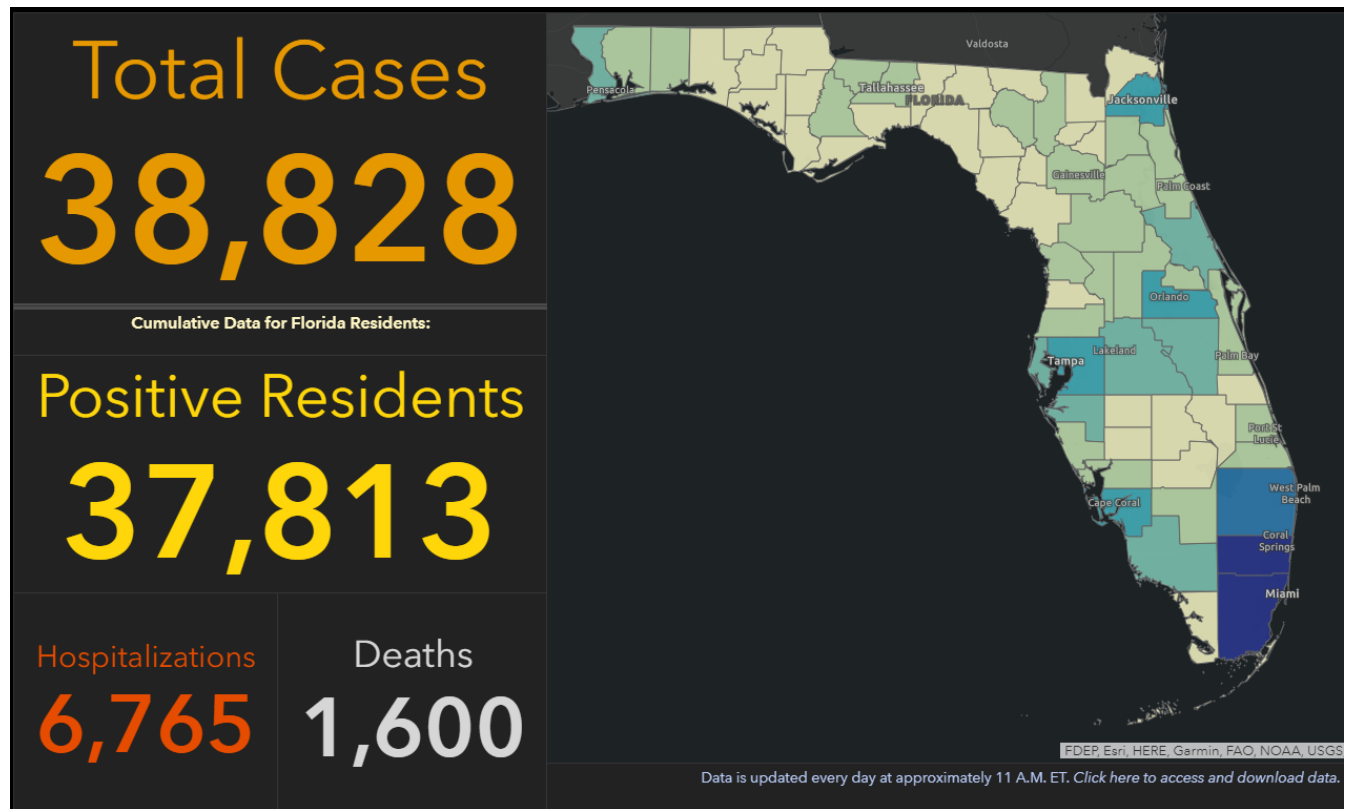

### COVID-19 Test Collection Sites

- COVID-19 Test Collection Site at TIAA Bank Field Lot J (Jacksonville Jaguars Stadium)
  - Open to St. Johns County residents and anyone that would like to be tested.
    - Must have Identification

This site will operate from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week, for as long as supplies last and weather permitting. While a doctor's order and appointment are not required at this location, clients will be evaluated by a medical professional on site.
- Coronavirus Test Collection Sites in St. Johns County are as follows:
  - Flagler Health+ - 400 Healthpark Blvd., St. Augustine, FL 32086. Outdoors at tent
    - Flagler Health+ has established an outdoor test collection site for patients who have a physician order for COVID-19 testing and have pre-registered through the system. The drive through process takes about three minutes. Test results are taking at least 4-5 days on average. Tests results are communicated back to the patient's primary care doctor who notifies the patient of the results. Positive results are also reported to the Department of Health.
  - Florida Department of Health in St. Johns County (DOH-SJC) -St. Johns County Health & Human Services Building , 200 San Sebastian View, St. Augustine, FL 32084. (904) 209-3250
    - As part of disease control investigations, DOH-SJC is collecting specimens for COVID-19 laboratory testing. As part of disease investigations, specimen

collection is by appointment-only for those individuals who meet the CDC criteria for testing. For more information about COVID-19 and testing, the Florida Department of Health in St. Johns County's COVID-19 Call Center is open seven days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and can be reached at 904-209-3250. Calls received outside of standard business hours will be redirected to a DOH-SJC Public Health Nurse.

- Avencia Medical - Julington Creek Branch, 1633 Race Track Rd, St Johns, FL 32259 (904) 230-6988
  - Open to the public from 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Saturday and Sunday, as a COVID-19 collection site. Collection is being treated as an urgent care doctor's visit and clients must bring a photo ID and insurance card. The collection facility has a tent outside and have requested that visitors wait in their cars for paperwork to be brought to them by a staff member.
  - Performing antibody testing. It is NOT required BUT helpful to bring a copy of test results to show you have previously tested positive for the virus. It is \$255.00 total including the office visit for the antibody testing. Some insurances will cover costs. Individuals can walk-in WITHOUT an appointment but CAN NOT have symptoms.

Collection may be billed as a doctor's visit and/or lab test. The collection facility has signage and has requested that visitors follow the signs as instructed for parking. - St. Johns County EOC is activated to a Level II – Partial Activation.

### Government / Schools / Hospital Status

St. Johns County Government	Status:	Operational – St. Johns County facilities are operating under limited public access restrictions.
City of St. Augustine	Status:	Operational – City offices are closed to the Public. All services are available via telephone, email and internet.
City of St. Augustine Beach	Status:	Operational – Public Meeting Rooms closed. Limited public access to City facilities.
St. Johns County School District	Status:	St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) students will continue online/remote learning through the end of the school year. All school offices will be closed to the public. Access will be limited to phone or email.
Florida School for Deaf and Blind	Status:	Florida School for Deaf and Blind students will continue online/remote learning through the end of the school year.
Flagler College	Status:	All classes will be online for the remainder of the spring semester. All college events through the end of May have also been canceled, including the May Graduation ceremony.
St. Johns River State College	Status:	<b>Classes will remain in an online format through the summer semester. All events have been canceled and all campuses will remain closed to the public until further notice.</b>
Flagler Hospital	Status:	Operational - All patient visitation has been suspended. Exceptions will be made for the most critical, extenuating circumstances and spouses/partners of Labor and Delivery patients. All entry into the hospital will be limited to the Emergency Department entrance.

### Community Reopening – Phase One

- City of St. Augustine will begin a phased reopening to include the following:
  - Restaurants in compliance with the guidelines may open, observing indoor seating at 25% occupancy and outside seating set at six feet apart. Serving alcohol with food will be permitted.
  - In-store retail shops can open at 25% capacity and will follow safety guidelines.
  - Museums and libraries can open at 25% of their building occupancy; however, interactive functions and exhibits must be closed.
  - Short-term vacation rentals remain suspended.
  - Hotels and commercial lodging may reopen at their discretion, in compliance with recommended guidelines.
  - Tour trains, trolleys and horse-drawn carriages may commence limited operations in Phase 1.
  - City-managed parking lots, on-street parking, and the parking garage are free.
  - The Visitor Information Center and Gift Shop will remain closed.

- City Hall will remain closed to the public; all services are available via telephone, email and internet.
- Drive-thru Customer Service window is open, but walk-in Customer Service at 50 Bridge Street remains closed.

- St. Johns County Reopening – Phase One

- Beaches – St. Johns County will resume on-beach driving beginning Monday, May 11, 2020, at all beach access ramps where sand conditions permit vehicular access. All standard on-beach driving tolls will apply and all annual passes purchased prior to the on-beach driving restrictions will be honored for the remainder of the season. In addition, the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners extended all 2020 annual on-beach driving passes through the 2021 beach season. Beginning Monday, May 11, annual beach passes may be purchased from all access ramp toll booths. Continued adherence to the CDC social distancing guidelines of limiting gatherings to no more than 10 persons and maintaining a minimum distance of six feet.
- Libraries - Offering curbside service at all branches from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays for patrons who place items on hold by calling a library or through the Library's website. Library buildings remain closed to the public. For more information on curbside service, visit [www.sjcpls.org/curbside-service/](http://www.sjcpls.org/curbside-service/) or call your branch library.
- Recreational Facilities - All recreational facilities, including recreation centers, pools, pavilions, etc., remain closed and unavailable for reservations or rentals.
- Recreational Programing - All recreational programing, including open play, camps, and league activities, remain suspended.
- St. Johns County Ocean and Fishing Pier – Open to the public with no access fee. All other facilities, including the Pier Gift Shop and pavilion, remain closed to the public and unavailable for reservations, rentals, or events, including farmers markets.
- St. Johns County Pet Center - St. Johns County Animal Control remains active and is responding to calls from the community, the St. Johns County Pet Center remains closed to the public.
- St. Augustine Amphitheatre and Ponte Vedra Concert Hall - All activities and events at the St. Augustine Amphitheatre and Ponte Vedra Concert Hall, including farmers markets, remain suspended.

- St. Johns County Clerk of Circuit Court & Comptroller's office will begin issuing marriage licenses and processing passport applications on Monday, May 11<sup>th</sup> for St. Johns County residents by appointment only. The public will be admitted by appointment only through the north entrance of the St. Johns County Courthouse at 4010 Lewis Speedway in St. Augustine. All persons entering the courthouse must practice social distancing.

- Appointments for marriage licenses and simple marriage ceremonies conducted at the front counter will be scheduled on weekdays between 9:15 a.m. and 4:15 p.m. Admittance will be for the two individuals applying for the license and/or ceremony only; no family members, friends or guests may be admitted into the building at this time. Payment must be in the form of credit card or check, as cash cannot be accepted at this time. Please call (904) 819-3632 to schedule an appointment.
- Passport appointments may be scheduled between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. weekdays for the individual applying only; no friends, family members or guests may be admitted at this time. A money order or personal check payable to the U.S. Department of State will be required for processing fees. Acceptance fees must be paid by credit card or check, as cash cannot be accepted at this time. Passport applicants are

encouraged to call (904) 819-3632 to schedule an appointment and to verify which application to complete prior to coming to the clerk's office.

- Department of Environmental Protection is implementing phase one to reopen Florida State Parks.
  - Anastasia State Park, Fort Mose Historic State Park and Faver-Dykes State Park are open for day use activities. Restroom availability may be limited. All other park facilities are closed. Visitors are expected to maintain distances of at least six feet apart and limit group size to ten or fewer people.

- Guana Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve has reopened outdoor amenities. This includes Middle and South beaches, Guana Trails, and the Guana Dam. North Beach will remain closed until further notice due to renovations currently under construction.
  - All restrooms, pavilions, and trash receptacles will remain closed.
- Governor Ron DeSantis Executive Order 20-112 - Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery.
  - For the duration of this order, all persons in Florida should:
    - Avoid congregating in large groups. Local jurisdictions shall ensure that groups of people greater than ten are not permitted to congregate in any public space that does not readily allow for appropriate physical distancing.
    - Avoid nonessential travel, including to U.S. states and cities outside of Florida with a significant presence of COVID-19.
    - Adhere to guidelines from the CDC regarding isolation for 14 days following travel on a cruise or from any international destination and any area with a significant presence of COVID-19.
  - Conditional Reopening
    - Restaurants and food establishments licensed under Chapters 500 or 509, Florida Statutes, may allow on-premises consumption of food and beverage, so long as they adopt appropriate social distancing measures and limit their indoor occupancy to no more than 25 percent of their building occupancy. In addition, outdoor seating is permissible with appropriate social distancing. Appropriate social distancing requires maintaining a minimum of 6 feet between parties, only seating parties of 10 or fewer people and keeping bar counters closed to seating.
    - In-store retail sales establishments may open storefronts if they operate at no more than 25 percent of their building occupancy and abide by the safety guidelines issued by the CDC and OSHA.
    - Medical elective procedures may resume when this order goes into effect. Hospital ambulatory surgical center, office surgery center, dental office, orthodontic office, endodontic office or other health care practitioners' office in the State of Florida may perform procedures only if:
      - The facility has the capacity to immediately convert additional facility-identified surgical and intensive care beds for treatment of COVID-19 patients in a surge capacity situation;
      - The facility has adequate personal protective equipment (PPE) to complete all medical procedures and respond to COVID-19 treatment needs, without the facility seeking any additional federal or state assistance regarding PPE supplies;

- The facility has not sought any additional federal, state, or local government assistance regarding PPE supplies since resuming elective procedures; and
  - The facility has not refused to provide support to and proactively engage with skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities and other long-term care residential providers.
- Remain closed
    - Bars, pubs and nightclubs that derive more than 50 percent of gross revenue from the sale of alcoholic beverages shall continue to suspend the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption.
    - Gyms and fitness centers and personal services such as salons and barber shops.
    - The prohibition on vacation rentals remains in effect for the duration of this order.
