## ATTENDANCE POLICY REMINDER

"If any member of a Board fails to attend three (3) consecutive, regularly scheduled meetings or five (5) of twelve (12) regular or special meetings or workshops of the Board, the Board shall declare the member's office vacant." If you are removed by staff for attendance reasons, you have the right to appeal to the BOCC for reinstatement. Sunshine Law —requires that public bodies performing business for the public should do so in the open and at a public place. "
Essentially, any communication between two members of the same board or committee can be a "meeting" and is prohibited by this law, unless it has been properly advertised and minutes are taken. Examples of potential violations are:

- 1. A telephone call from one board member to another regarding a matter that could be addressed by that board.
- 2. An email from a fellow board/committee member to another member about issues that could come before the Board they serve
