

Quarterly Highlights

- In reaction to Hurricane Ian, Marge Cirillo and the St. Johns County Chamber hosted a popup shop at the St. Johns County Government Building in St. Augustine. The event was partnered by various resource partners including the Economic Development Director. SBA and FEMA to share information with small business owners on forms of disaster assistance.
- The Florida SBDC at UNF's newest staff member, business consultant Christian Evangelista who joined the SBDC in October, is
 president of the BNI Nocatee chapter and is conducting weekly meetings with St. Johns County entrepreneurs and small business
 champions, expanding the visibility of SBDC services in the county.
- In October, Marge Cirillo hosted another Popup Shop in conjunction with the St. Johns County Chamber to provide information to small business owners in the St. Augustine area.
