




St. Johns County





Q2 How satisfied are you with the current household garbage, recycling, and yard waste collection program?*







Q5 Approximately, how many bags or loose items do you set outside of the container for household garbage collection?*











Q10 On a scale of 1 - 10 (10 = very supportive), how supportive are you of expanding automated collection for household garbage, similar to recycling collection?*
















Q21 How often do you use recycling collection at your residence?*



Q24 How often have you set out bulk items such as furniture, mattresses, or other household items in the last year?*



Q25 How often have you set out an appliance such as a washer, dryer, or refrigerator in the last year?*




Q26 If bulk items were limited, how often should items be collected by the service provider?*




