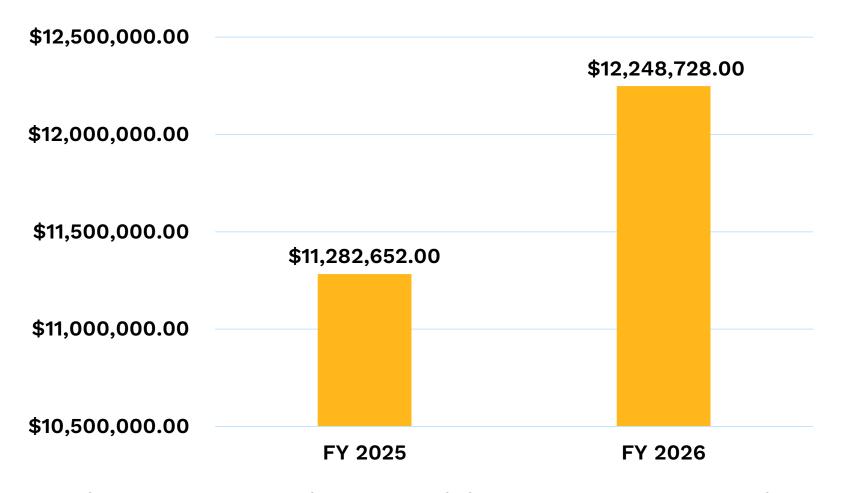




## Current 2025 BUDGET

- \$11 million from **General Fund**
- \$105K for State Aid Grant
- \$182K from donations
- Provides staff training & development
- Provides access to resources
- Up-to-date materials and technology

#### FY25 AND FY26 BUDGET COMPARISON



An 8.57% increase to the Library's original requested budget includes the cost of opening two new library locations for part of FY26.



#### LIBRARY PLANNING

#### **Aligning Library and County Strategic Plans**

- SJC Goal 2.A & 2.B: Community Well-being
  - Engage in Community Outreach events at least once per quarter systemwide
  - Build and expand partnerships with county and local organizations to host or co-host community programs
  - Improve community satisfaction with library events and programs
  - Establish centralized library staffing models

## **IMLS & State Library of Florida Funding**

#### We receive funding and services valued over \$156,000 each year

- Access To Online Databases: The State Library of Florida, through IMLS, offers database access to valuable content such as medical journals and academic resources services that would otherwise cost our library \$68,000 a year. Without this resource, access to peer-reviewed journals would be lost.
- Summer Reading Program: We received \$3,000 per year for supplies related to the Collaborative Summer Reading Program before the State Library of Florida recently discontinued access.
- Interlibrary Loan Service: We are in the process of moving to the State-sponsored interlibrary loan system, which is free and covers most shipping costs. If eliminated, we'd face nearly \$18,000 in added expenses costs that may be passed on to our patrons.
- Career Online High School: Through State Library of Florida funding, 23 local adult patrons earned accredited high school diplomas not GEDs through the Career Online High School program. The program ended when its \$15,000 funding was cut.
- **NEFLIN:** The Northeast Florida Library Information Network, a regional library cooperative funded through IMLS grants and membership dues, provides SJCPLS with training, project grants, and other support valued at \$57,962 in FY2023-2024.
- Ask A Librarian Chat Service: Ask a Librarian is Florida's virtual reference service, supported by over 100 libraries across various sectors. In one year, it answered 1,632 SJCPLS patron questions via chat, email, and SMS, with a market value to our county of \$3,949.44.

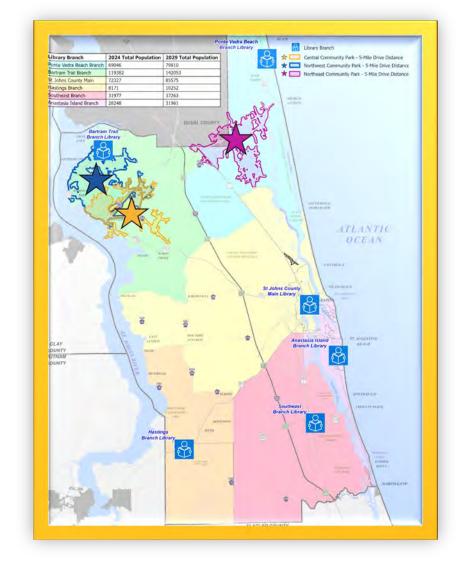

## PERSONNEL REQUEST FY 2026

- Current staff 98.1 FTE
- Requesting **12.4 FTE: 4.8 FTE** for existing locations, **7.6 FTE** for new locations
- Rollback request is **6.3 FTE: 3.8 FTE** for existing locations, **2.5 FTE** for new locations
- Internal restructuring created promotional advancements through reclassifications (these are existing positions not additional FTEs with a cost savings of \$300,000.00 vs. new positions)

FY 2026 both budget requests include a recommendation to increase non-resident library card fees to \$100 a year.



## ROLLBACK IMPACT ON SERVICES

- For SJCPLS, "rollback" = \$670,703 reduction
- Decrease in public service hours
- Reduction in public programming, affecting SJC plan!
- Decrease in funding for new materials, including e-resources/databases
- Delayed staff recruiting for new libraries
- Reduction in guard and temp staffing services
- Reduction in library courier service (currently 7 days)
